Tracking the Wildlife of Algonquin Park

This canoe trip will focus on tracking and learning from the animals that call Algonquin park home. Who lives here? Where do they sleep? What do they eat? What do they have to do to survive throughout all four seasons? These are only some of the questions that we will attempt to answer.

By learning to ask the right questions and look for 'key' pieces of information we can begin to see the world through the eyes of the animals that we track. As we learn more about these animals we begin to see and understand the role that they play in maintaining a healthy and balanced eco-system.

This trip will not involve strenuous portages or lengthy paddles, but will instead focus on learning as much as we can from the animals in this beautiful wilderness setting.

"When we track, we pick up a string. At the far end of that string a being is moving, existing, still connected to the track that we gaze upon. The animal's movement is still contained in that track, along with the smallest of external and internal details. As we follow these tracks, we begin to become the very animal we track. It is the track that connects us to that grand consciousness and expands us to limitless horizons."
